- The number of required credits
 - Master's program: 30 credits
 - Doctoral program: 20 credits

- Compulsory subject for the master's program
 - Quantitative Methods for Management and Policy Analysis

- Subject groups
 - The subject groups A, B, and C are set for each course. As a completion requirement, you must take 6 credits from Group A, 6 credits from Group B, and 6 credits from Group C. Note that there is a mistake in the handbook.
 - Note that the subject group divisions have changed since last year. Please be sure to check this academic year's handbook for the division of the groups.
 - Note that as a basic rule, the subject groups follow the divisions determined in the academic year of entry. If the subject groups were to change next academic year, the subject groups determined in your academic year of entry will apply.

- Overseas training
 - Students take the initiative in making appointments to visit corporations and planning what they will do at those corporations. From April onwards, students work on this continually before finally traveling overseas in around September.
 - It has not yet been confirmed that the program will go ahead next year due to the coronavirus pandemic.
