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3. Master's Program Application Schedule A

3-1. Examination subject

(1) Document Screening

Document Screening will be based on the following three documents.

—TOEFL Official Score

—Academic transcript from the university from which you graduated

—Research plan for the master's program: Please download the form from our website.

•Applicants must take the TOEFL-iBT test or TOEFL-iBT Home Edition test by July 31, and request ETS to transmit your score to our graduate school. Applicants who already have a TOEFL score must also request ETS to transmit the score report to our graduate school. An official TOEFL score from a test administered after September 2020 is valid. For more information on submitting TOEFL official score, please refer to the "Notice regarding Foreign Language (English) Examinations in 2023 Graduate School of Engineering, The University of Tokyo Entrance Examinations (How to submit TOEFL score)(Master's Program, Doctoral Program【Application Schedule A】)".

•A copy of the TOEFL score must be submitted with the application. If you take the TOEFL test after the application, please submit a copy of the score to the department office (E-mail : nyushi@tmi.t.u-tokyo.ac.jp) as soon as you know it.

•Successful applicants for the document screening will be announced on the bulletin board and our website by 12:00 p.m. August 18. No inquiries regarding acceptance or rejection by phone, fax, or e-mail will be accepted. Only those who pass the document screening may take the written and oral examination.

(2) Written Examination

Foreign language - English

English proficiency will be evaluated by TOEFL Official Score.

Problems designed to test mathematical and logical ability

It will be conducted on campus.

(3) Oral Examination

It will be conducted on campus. Applicants will be interviewed about their academic knowledge and motivation for research.

3-3. Others

- If you need to ask about research fields of the Master's Program, you can ask faculty in advance. However, applicants may not contact the faculty after the application has been submitted.

4. Doctoral Program -Application Schedule A

Primary examination

4-1. Examination subject

(1) Written Examination

Foreign language – English

- English proficiency will be evaluated by TOEFL Official Score.
- Applicants must take the TOEFL-iBT test or TOEFL-iBT Home Edition test by July 31, and request ETS to transmit your score to our graduate school. Applicants who already have a TOEFL score must also request ETS to transmit the score report to our graduate school. An official TOEFL score from a test administered after September 2020 is valid. For more information on submitting TOEFL official score, please refer to the "Notice regarding Foreign Language (English) Examinations in 2023 Graduate School of Engineering, The University of Tokyo Entrance Examinations (How to submit TOEFL score)(Master's Program, Doctoral Program【Application Schedule A】)".
- A copy of the TOEFL score must be submitted with the application. If you take the TOEFL test after the application, please submit a copy of the score to the department office (E-mail: nyushi@tmi.t.u-tokyo.ac.jp) as soon as you know it.
- Applicants who have completed or are expected to complete a master's program of the University of Tokyo are exempted from this examination.

Problems designed to test mathematical and logical ability

It will be conducted on campus. Those who have completed or are expected to complete a master's degree in this department of TMI are exempted from this examination.

(2) Oral Examination

- It will be conducted on campus. Applicants are required to make a presentation (15-minute) on their master's thesis and research plan for the doctoral program. If there is no master's thesis, supplement it with an alternative research work. A QA session will then be held to interview the applicants about their academic knowledge in their field of specialization, readiness for the doctoral program, and ability to conduct research.
- Applicants must email the following two documents to the faculty member in charge of admissions (nyushi@tmi.t.u-tokyo.ac.jp) no later than two days before the oral examination.
 - (a) A summary of your master's thesis, including figures and tables, no more than 4 pages in A4 size paper. If the applicant hasn't written a master's thesis for any reason, a summary

of alternative research work is acceptable.

(b) A summary of research plan after entering the doctoral Program, one-page in A4 size paper.

• For Applicants who have completed or are expected to complete a master's program by September 2022 and wish to enroll in October 2022, the oral examination will be combined with the secondary examination. Please send an electronic (or scanned) version of your master's thesis or an alternative research achievement to the faculty member in charge of admissions (nyushi@tmi.t.u-tokyo.ac.jp) by e-mail at least two days before the date of the oral examination.

• Applicants must discuss their research plan with the faculty member with whom they wish to supervise before applying for the doctoral program.

II Secondary Examination

The Secondary examination consists of an interview on your master's thesis or alternative research achievement. The examination is in principle held in early to mid-February 2023, and applicants will be notified of examination dates and locations.

- Full-time employees of educational, academic research institutions or companies can enroll in the doctoral program with keeping your current employee's status.
- Our department allow admissions in October 2022 in addition to admissions in April 2023, if they can meet the requirements.
- Applicants to the doctoral program are required to complete and submit the "Survey of prospective faculty supervisor".
